Weak >> : Project objectives/priorities were not successfully solved or addressed. Notes/criteria specific to digitally-designed projects (e.g. web design or Flash presentations). Notes/criteria specific to Interior Design, space-planning projects. INT **Graphic & Content Concepts** Outstanding How well do the concepts relate to the assigned goals/priorities? [Relevance/Appropriateness] Is the study designed as a whole, as a complete, unified presentation? Are all pages/sections formally related to each other? [Unity] Has any sort of theme (graphic, narrative, characters, humor, etc.) been used to enliven and unify the whole? Is there a consistent page/board design (not necessarily identical, but unified)? Is order/structure developed and consistent? Does the designer *engage and entertain* the reader? Is *enthusiasm* for the subject apparent? Has the designer found a way to make each page, and its content, engaging? Exceptions \_ Is the flow of ideas and information organized to lead the reader naturally from one idea to another? Are any special features (overlays, cutouts, etc.) used to enhance the visual interest and content of the study/exhibit? Is the layout or presentation design in *any* way related to the forms of the subject being studied? (unity in content and form.) **Overall Design & Layout** Outstanding Meets Objectives Have formal elements been thoughtfully unified on each page? Does each page have a hierarchy of emphasis and relief? Size roughly 8x10+ (unless discussed with instructor or compensating pages/spreads added); **INT** Exhibit: 18x24 Is negative space used well? Not too crowded...not too sparse? Does each graphic/text element have enough breathing room? Are margins/borders adequate to contain/isolate content? Are page elements placed/ordered well with respect to the field? Does type contrast well with background elements (or is type confused by competition)? Type aligned/spaced well? Is type consistent with the mood or character of the rest of the book/page design? Is type, calligraphy or text consistent (unified) throughout? ...legible and of adequate contrast with backgrounds? Do some pages feel less finished or less complete than others? Foreground-background contrasts established well? **DIG** Is page/content navigation intuitive, convenient, logical and well-ordered. Is medium used effectively? **INT** Has the unique shape and height of the space been exploited? Is space itself used? (or do walls basically support 2D displays?) **INT** Has traffic flow been designed to contribute to a logical and undistracted progression? **Graphic Communication** Outstanding Has the designer discovered relevant and interesting design features in the subject — relevant to each page's topic? Has the designer found effective graphic means to communicate and emphasize distinctive design features/content? Have adequate text, diagrams, arrows, cutaways, etc. been used to make the discoveries clear and obvious to the reader? Does page layout emphasize decoration, or information? (that is, does layout compete with info, or enhance it?) **INT** Have plans, elevations, isometric or perspective drawings (sketches or renderings) been used? **INT** Has the space been presented in a way that enables the client/viewer to envision and imagine it well? **DIG** Have animated or interactive features been used to more fully communicate content? Craftsmanship Outstanding Meets Objectives Is the medium used well? Are the graphic/interactive/animation capabilities of the chosen medium taken advantage of? Are elements (graphics and type) well-oriented and positioned? Elements/images/prints cropped/trimmed well? Are glued and layered elements neat and secure? Are there ragged, irregular edges, scars or stains or other distractions? Are photos well framed, well illuminated, and printed well? Adequate resolution? Pixelation? Of consistent quality? Is type/text professional and clean? Well-spaced & formatted? Guidelines used for handwritten text? Of consistent quality? Is binding secure and neat? Does binding allow the book/content to be viewed easily and pages protected? **DIG** Is navigation intuitive and flexible? Do links work correctly? Project Development (Creative process) Outstanding Were the project's partial deadlines met? [note that daily, in-class crit grades are separate grades from this] Was analysis and concept development begun early? ...in time to assess a variety of possible solutions? Was time used well (or was much of the work rushed during the week before final submission?) Were many ideas and techniques explored? Were sketches, studies and layouts used to explore a wide variety of options?
