Before being formally admitted to the B.F.A. program, candidates must:

Complete 15 hours of core courses with a GPA of 3.0; Pass Sophomore Portfolio Review — a portfolio presentation and critique that demontrates seriousness of interest and adequate skills;

Submit a completed BFA application form; and Receive a letter from the department Chair approving continuation of work toward the B.F.A. degree. To remain in this program, students must maintain a 3.0 GPA in art.
